Of course tonight we are **not only gathered to recognize the incredible achievements of the committed, brilliant media professionals** among us. **We are also here to be reminded of the power of truth and storytelling**.

As the head of the United States Agency for International Development in Kenya and East Africa, we recognize — the *United States recognizes* — the invaluable role of a free and independent media to the health, security and economic growth of societies across the globe.

In the United States, we are sincere when we call independent, public media the 4th branch of government. Because we know that fact finding, investigative reporting, and public accountability are absolutely vital to the functioning of a healthy, growing democracy.

And these are not just platitudes. Today, the U.S. government is the largest public donor to free and independent media development around the world. At USAID across East

Africa, and in partnership with IGAD, we support a variety of initiatives that encourage robust social dialogue, to help push forward inclusive policy decision making and transformative development.

To give just a brief example:

Here in Kenya, over the past few years **USAID's Resilience Learning activity has invested** in the skills strengthening for 250 journalists and media practitioners in this country's nine arid and semi-arid counties. These training sessions are invaluable, and we've seen the power of equipping local journalists with the knowledge, resources and networks they need to document impactful development in their regions. We've seen that armed with the skills to warn the public about coming challenges, like drought and disease, their reporting has saved lives and livelihoods.

The incredible **Hesborn Etyang** (Hes-borne Eh-tee-yang) working with the **People Daily**Newspaper is a shining example of this partnership. **He's here with us tonight,** and he was one of those trained and supported to report on COVID-19 interventions in Turkana

County. His story; "Village 'doctors' saving young lives in Turkana amid COVID-19 pandemic" won the Digital Health Category award during the 2022 Annual Journalism Excellence Awards (AJEA) organized by the Media Council of Kenya.

But the United State's support for press corps around the globe is not just about our individual projects. Perhaps just as importantly, we at USAID encourage local media scrutiny and transparency in our own work.

Because we know that it is incredibly important that people are kept informed on what we are doing and why we are doing it. And it is vital that we as USAID are kept accountable through the independent transparency of the press, which ensures that our development aid is working in the way we intend.

Supplied with this information, citizens here in Kenya and across the region, are able to effectively contribute to their own development, and can determine their own path to growth and prosperity.

I want to thank the journalists here who have covered stories where USAID has had an impact, and I want to encourage you all: keep asking my colleagues and I tough questions; keep pressing us on complex and difficult topics; we are all the better for your reporting!

To wrap up, tonight we're celebrating not only the winners of these awards, but all those who work tirelessly to inform, educate, and empower communities across the East African region.

The United States remains committed to strengthen the media landscape by enhancing press freedom, and promoting responsible journalism. We will be your steadfast partner as we continue to ensure community voices are at the forefront of development storytelling.

Together, we are working to build a future where the voices of all citizens can be heard and where transparency and integrity are the foundations of governance. I commend all the journalists and media organizations here this evening for their dedication and hard work. You truly inspire us all.
